What is Erasmus+?

Erasmus+ is an EU programme that supports education, training, youth and sport in Europe.

The programme has an estimated budget of €26.2 billion. This is almost double the amount of the previous programme (2014-2020).

For the period 2021-2027, the programme puts a strong emphasis on social inclusion, the green and digital transition and promoting young people's participation in democratic life.

It supports the priorities and actions set out in the European Education Area, the Digital Agenda for Education and the European Skills Agenda. In addition, the programme helps to

the implementation of the European Pillar of Social Rights implementing the EU Youth Strategy 2019-2027 developing the European dimension in sport
